**JCT600 helps stars travel in style at the Bradford International Film Festival**



Yorkshire-based family business JCT600 is once again providing executive cars and drivers to chauffeur celebrities attending the Bradford International Film Festival over the next week.

It is the eighth year that the company has provided the service and this year's festival, the first since the town became UNESCO's World's First City of Film, started in style.
